MIGRANT SERVICES

Settlement Engagement and Transition Support (SETS)

- To promote and assist self-reliance for eligible new migrants in Bundaberg regional area
- General settlement information – available in own language
- Referrals to agencies and other service providers
- Practical support, assistance and advocacy
- Help in domestic violence situations
- Information, education and training workshops

Community Action for a Multicultural Society (CAMS)

- Information and referral services
- Culturally And Linguistically Diverse (CALD) community development and advocacy assistance

- NO loans for non-essential items, household bills, debt consolidation, etc
