 Queensland Community Support Scheme	Telephone 1800 600 300 or 3028 9360	<p>The Queensland Community Support Scheme (QCSS) provides low intensity supports to assist you to live independently, increase connections and participate in your local community, thereby reducing social isolation.</p> <p>The QCSS can help you get out and about in your community, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> shopping, banks or post office recreational activities such as local social groups or the library finding and linking to other supports, services or activities in the community to increase your independence and connection to your community. <p>It can also help you at home with things like:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> planning and preparing meals household chores personal care, such as showering and dressing essential yard maintenance to ensure safety in access and mobility around the external environment of the home. <p>Contact the QCSS Access Point. Eligible patients are able to apply for a subsidy to assist with travel and accommodation costs of accessing specialist medical services.  Queensland Government Taxi Subsidy Scheme	1300 134 755	The Taxi Subsidy Scheme (TSS) subsidises taxi travel for people with a disability who meet the eligibility criteria and pays half the value of a member's taxi fare, up to a maximum of \$30 per trip. There is no limit on the number of taxi journeys a member may take to attract the subsidy. The subsidy is paid to taxi drivers—members have no additional costs. TSS membership lasts for a maximum of 5 years. To extend your membership you must reapply before the expiry date. The Queensland Government has confirmed that eligible National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) participants can continue to access the TSS until appropriate transport support arrangements are in place, up to 31 December 2026. https://www.qld.gov.au/disability/out-and-about/subsidies-concessions-passes/taxi-subsidy		To be eligible you must be a permanent resident of Queensland and fully meet at least 1 of the following 6 eligibility criteria: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Physical disability requiring dependence on a wheelchair for all mobility outside the home. Severe ambulatory problem that cannot functionally be improved and restricts walking to an extremely limited distance. Total loss of vision or severe permanent visual impairment (both eyes). Severe and uncontrollable epilepsy. Intellectual impairment or dementia resulting in the need to be accompanied by another person at all times for travel on public transport. Severe emotional and/or behaviour disorders with a level of disorganisation resulting in the need to be accompanied by another person at all times for travel on public transport.
